## Hebrew Alphabet Studies:

"hey" means "behold" or "window"  
(Strong's Exhaustive Concordance #1887)

ה was added to give Abrah<sup>ה</sup>m & Sara<sup>ה</sup> their new names

The sound 'hey' is made by exhaling breath.

The 'hey' at the beginning of a word is the prefix meaning 'the.'

"hey" also is the Hebrew number 5

**5 is the number of GRACE:** Here is GRACE:

There were **5 women** in the Matthew **genealogy** of Jesus:  
(note: women aren't even supposed to be in Biblical genealogies)

- 1) Tamar (Tamar) - who committed incest (Gen. 38:6-30)
- 2) Rachab (Rahab) - considered a prostitute (Joshua 2:1)
- 3) Ruth (a Moabite) - considered to be an idolator (Ruth 2:2)
- 4) wife of Urias\* (Bathsheba) - an adultress (2 Samuel 11:3)
- 5) Mary - considered to have been a fornicator (John 8:41)

\*Urias (Uriah) the Hittite was vindicated by being in Jesus's genealogy.

**5 is also the number of the TORAH, where we see Jesus as:**

**Genesis** - Creator, Shield, Judge, Covenant Maker, Provider

**Exodus** - Deliverer, Lamb, Rock, Tabernacle.

**Leviticus** - High Priest, Healer, Redeemer

**Numbers** - Cloud by Day, Fire by Night, Serpent Lifted Up, Star of Jacob

**Deuteronomy** - Law-Giver, The Prophet, The Rock, Shiloh

## LEVITICUS\* 1:1

Leviticus has a *different code* in its first verse—the Holy Tetragrammaton (YHVH—יהוה) (translated "Lord" or "I AM") is encoded at **8-letter intervals** in **Lev. 1:1**.

The focal point of the Torah is YHVH (JESUS in Greek)

**SAMPLE Torah Code**

**Psalms** is divided into 5 parts. In the book 'Hidden Prophecies in the Psalms,' J.R. Church takes Psalms, the 19th book of the O.T. (*Hebrews is the 19th book of the N.T.*) & pairs each Psalm with the Hebrews (Jews) in the 1900's. (i.e., **Ps. 44:22 in 1944; Ps. 67:7 in 1967; Ps. 73:1 in 1973..**)

Here's a summation of his thesis:

**Genesis Psalms 1-41** (the beginnings of restoration)

**Exodus Psalms 42-72** (Jews return to the land)

**Leviticus Psalms 73-89** (the priesthood is restored)

**Numbers Psalms 90-106** (Israel is numbered for war)

**Deuteronomy Psalms 107-150** (Israel is established forever)

\***Leviticus** is 90% dictated from the mouth of God. The reason is seems repetitious & boring to us is because the whole book is written in layers of Hebrew codes—probably more complex than the human DNA code—which, incidentally, has 22 numbered chromosomes (just like the Hebrew alphabet has 22 letters—in addition to the X & Y chromosomes (possibly a 'typology' of the Christ & the Holy Spirit).
