

# 21 Hebrew Alphabet Studies:

"kaph" means: "palm of the hand"

(\*Strong's Exhaustive Concordance #3709)

"K" (in English)



The modern word for "Yes" in Hebrew is כן "ken" or "cain."

The word for "Priest" is כהן "Kohan" or "cohen."

The "hey" (the 'breath' or 'spirit' of life) is inserted into the Hebrew word "yes," — meaning that a priest is one who has the Spirit breathed into their "yes" to God.

Another Hebrew word for priest is kagoonah כהונה

'Kaph' at the beginning of a word means 'like' or 'into,' or 'inside.'

**FINALS** (letters that change shape when used at the end of a word)  
There are 5 Hebrew letters are 'finals.'

kaph - כ becomes ך

mem - מ becomes ם

nun - נ becomes ן

pe - פ becomes ף

tzaddi - צ becomes ץ

Every Hebrew letter is ALSO a number (see next page).  
This is called 'GEMATRIA.'

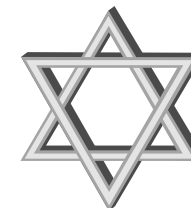
The finals (called 'sofits' have their own numerical value  
(different from the regular letter).

For instance, kaph כ = 20, but ך = 500

\*No English word is translated for the middle word of this sentence—'ayth.'

It is made up of the **FIRST & LAST** letters of the Hebrew alphabet—Aleph & Tav—pronounced 'ayth.'  
 So, right in the **center** of the First Seven Words is the **First & Last** (identified as JESUS in the last book of the Bible).  
 The unspoken word here may represent JESUS as the CENTER of ALL.

(Elsewhere, 'ayth' is usually translated: near, with, by, at, among, against, for, from, in, before, thou and with.)

## MATHEMATICAL DESIGN in the DIVINE PROLOGUE

Hebrew & Greek are the only totally **alpha-numeric languages**. (Latin only has a few letters that are also numbers (I, V, X, L, D & M). Here are a few interesting mathematical sums in these first 7 words.
