## Where did we get BIBLE CHAPTER & VERSE NUMBERS?

The Latin Bible was divided into **numbered chapters** in the 1200's. Gutenberg invented the printing press in AD\* 1440 and the first book printed with it was the Latin Vulgate '**Gutenberg Bible.**'

In AD **1535**, King Henry VIII martyred William Tyndale for translating parts of the Latin Bible into common English. Tyndale's last words were: '**Lord, open the King of England's eyes**'

In AD **1551**, Robert Stephanus, a French printer, added **verse numbers** to those chapters. These were used in the first English Bible--the **GENEVA BIBLE**--printed in **AD 1560**. Pilgrims carried the Geneva Bible to the New World in **AD 1620**.

Tyndale's prayer was answered in **AD 1604**, when King James authorized 60 multi-lingual university graduates to translate ancient Hebrew, Aramaic & Greek manuscripts into an English Bible. The KJV was completed in **AD 1611** and soon followed the Geneva Bible.

*[Note: William Shakespeare helped translate the Hebrew book of Psalms so it would flow poetically to music in English. The other translators rewarded him on his 46th birthday by putting his name in Psalm 46 (count 46 words from the start and 46 words backward from the end for 'shake' and 'spear'). It's interesting that he was fluent in Hebrew and often quoted the Torah in his plays in an age when Jews were not at all welcome in England--perhaps explaining why he wrote 'Merchant of Venice' <https://nosweatshakespeare.com> (to deflect suspicion?)]*

Throughout history, God's Word has been not only preserved, but bears the 'fingerprints' of God **and** the men He has chosen to preserve it.

And, the **middle CHAPTER & VERSE** of those Bibles

(out of **1,189 CHAPTERS**) was right **between** these two verses:

Psalm **118:8** "It is better to trust in the Lord than to put confidence in man."

**center of the KJV Bible** (many verses are omitted in other translations)

Psalm **118:9** "It is better to trust in the Lord than to put confidence in princes."

\*B.C. & A.D.

Western civilization begins calendars with the birth of Jesus Christ, hence the year 2026 means that Jesus was born about 2,026 years ago (the exact date is not known--it could be 4-6 years earlier).

Legal documents say 'In the year of our Lord...' ('*Anno Domini*' in Latin).

History before that is called B.C. (*Before Christ*)

(*humanist scholars are changing B.C. to B.C.E.-- 'Before the Common Era'*) and those years are counted backward to the creation of Adam. (see *Christ's genealogy from his mother's side in Luke 3:23-38*)

# Numerical "Coincidences" in the Bible



The Holy Bible is the handiwork of the Creator of all life. Therefore, it should not be surprising to find puzzles, anomalies, riddles, mysteries, signs & wonders (things that make you wonder) throughout the greatest Book ever written.

It is also not surprising that the only two languages (Hebrew & Greek) that are completely alpha-numeric (every letter is also a number) are the two primary languages used to pen the Bible. Bible Codes (only found in the Hebrew & Greek texts used to translate the KJV Bible) abound and modern computers are breaking some of these codes--although they have built-in mechanisms to make them impossible to accurately predict the future (i.e., encoded words have been found encompassing passages of discovered codes that essentially say 'cancelled').
